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Spring 2018 EQAO Results



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Keeping Our School Safe and Healthy

If you have a child with a Prevalent Medical Condition (Anaphylaxis, Asthma, Diabetes, and/or Epilepsy) we want to make sure we have a current Plan of Care to support your child. The Plan of Care form is a new document that replaces the Emergency Action Plan. All parents of children with Prevalent Medical Conditions are asked to fill out the new Plan of Care and submit to the school. You can download the forms here dsbn.org/prevalent-medical-conditions. School Cash Online

With School Cash Online, you will be able to approve permission forms and make payments for items online. Understanding that we're quickly becoming a cashless society, we know it can sometimes be a challenge to find exact change for items and then send it to school through your child's backpack. Using School Cash Online, you'll be able to use your debit, credit card or echeque to make

quick and easy payments online. It will also allow you to track payments made and receive an invoice for your purchases.

School Cash Online is a safe, reliable portal that will ensure the security of your information. The system is already active. You are able to gain access through the School Cash button which has been placed on our school website. We are asking that you click on the button and

follow the simple instructions to register. Registration should take less than five minutes. If you registered last year, you do not need to register again! If you require some assistance registering for School Cash Online, please visit the office and we will be happy to help you get started!.





Canadian Cognitive Abilities Test

All Grade 4 students will take the Canadian Cognitive Abilities Test during the period of October 9 and 22, 2018. This assessment helps to identify individual student needs and abilities to ensure appropriate programs are provided as well as information about student strengths in verbal, quantitative, and non-verbal reasoning. The assessment provides a benchmark as students complete future achievement tests, whether these tests are teacher-generated, board-wide or provincial.





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Free Money For Your Child's Future

What is the Canada Learning Bond (CLB)?

The Canada Learning Bond (CLB) is a government program that gives \$500 in education money to children born on or after January 1, 2004 whose families receive the Canada Child Benefit Supplement (family net income of \$45,916 or less or more based on number of children).

Sound good? Keep reading...

- ⇒ The Government will add \$100 more every year the child is eligible, up to age 15.
- ⇒ Each child could get up to \$2000 (plus interest) in RESP contributions!
- ⇒ NO family contribution is required

⇒ The Canada Learning Bond is retroactive for children born 2004 or after

Please note: We recommend that students work on DreamBox independently! If you watch your child work on it and you think it is too hard, please let us know!

Students in Kindergarten through Grade 8 have access to Dream-Box Learning®'s Math Program. This is an online, Intelligent Adaptive Learning[™] program that helps all students improve proficiency, conceptual understanding, and automaticity related to the K-8 curriculum. The student driven learning environment differentiates content, pace, and sequence for the highest

levels of student achievement so every student can learn to think critically, understand math deeply and have confidence in their math thinking. We strongly recommend that all of our students in Kindergarten through Grade 8 access Dream-Box for about 60 minutes weekly and that sessions are at least 20 minutes in length.


