National Day for Truth & Reconciliation

Marking this day of significance with solidarity and support

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation became a federally observed day of recognition in 2021 and is observed on September 30th each year. To help commemorate this day of significance, schools were provided with a new flag created by the Survivor's Secretariat that was flown at the DSBN Ed Centre and all elementary and secondary schools and many students and staff wore orange shirts to demonstrate their support and solidarity. Students from Greater Fort Erie Secondary School, Garrison Road Public School and Peacebridge Public School joined members from the Fort Erie Native Friendship Centre and wider community on their Unity Walk in Fort Erie. Following their participation, secondary students shared positive feedback, noting they felt the experience gave teachers extra time to support their learning about the significance of this important day. Many principals and teachers also shared an appreciation for the informative and user-friendly resources made available by DSBN's Indigenous Education team.
