The playground was deemed no longer safe and was removed when the surface was retarmacked. Each class has a set of recess toys e.g. a variety of balls, scoops etc which the students thoroughly enjoy. All students are now able to access the back field as well as the side yard. 'Creative Playground' has drawn a sketch of games to paint onto the side yard. These typically last about five years.
